WILTSHIRE PLAYER ACHIEVEMENTS 2021

LEWIS FLETCHER

Lewis Fletcher, Ramsbury TC and County Coach, won a fourth successive National title with his partner, Esah Hayat over the weekend of 6th/7th November.

Lewis and Esah have developed a highly successful doubles partnership and led Great Britain to the silver medal in the



2018 Dresse Cup, deaf tennis's World Team Championship for male players and the deaf tennis equivalent of the Davis Cup, while a year later they were also silver medallists at the World Deaf Championships in Turkey.

However, their latest success brought a fourth successive National title as the top seeds won all three of their men's doubles round-robin matches in straight sets, beating runners-up Dan Tunstall, who coaches at Trowbridge Westbourne TC and Peter Willcox 6-2, 6-3 in the decisive match of the weekend.





WILTSHIRE PLAYER ACHIEVEMENTS 2021

GILES HUSSEY

Giles has had his most successful year to date. Going into his last year of eligibility he transferred to Tennessee. Individually Giles reached a NCAA singles ranking of 80.

Tennessee won the Southern Eastern Conference which enabled them to qualify for the NCAA championships. At this event they reached the semi finals which is an incredible achievement.

Upon leaving College in America, Giles has embarked on a professional tennis career. In a short period of time, he has achieved so much already. He gained his first ATP ranking in June



at a tournament in Greece and he has gone on to win his first professional title in Mexico and currently has a career high world ranking of 875. Giles also competed in the UK pro league and finished 4th is the grand final event which he qualified for due to his performances in the earlier events.

AMELIA BISSETT

Amelia started off the year in January/February travelling to Egypt for 4 weeks to compete in ITF Women's 15K tournaments. Her start on the road to a Professional Career. She gained her first ITF Women's points in week 3 and has now a professional ranking. Amelia also got to the Quarter finals in doubles in Egypt. Therefore, she now has a singles ranking and a separate doubles ranking for the Women's Tour.

In March, Amelia travelled to the Dominican Republic to compete in the Junior U18 ITF grade 2 tournament where she won the Doubles partnering a Swedish girl.

Amelia then competed in June in the Grade 1 Junior ITF tournament at Roehampton just before Wimbledon and made it to the quarterfinals in doubles partnering Matilda Mutavdzic. Unfortunately, Amelia struggled during the summer with injuries and did compete at Junior Wimbledon in singles and doubles, after only being on court for 2 weeks trying to get fit.



Once she was up and running again Amelia competed at the Pro League in Aldershot in July and lost in the semi-final and then competed at the British Tour at the NTC in the same month and won her group.

In August, Amelia competed in the British Tour in Newcastle and was runner-up. In October she won the British Tour in Taunton.

Amelia is currently competing in Mexico for 4 weeks trying to gain valuable experience and hopefully success on the women's tour.

Amelia has had a very frustrating year due to injuries but hopefully 2022 will bring more success on the Women's tour as she leaves the junior's behind.

DAN HOPKINS

Wanborough's Dan Hopkins is another Wiltshire National Champion.

Dan is coached by Becky Watts at Wanborough and has had a great year. Dan recently competed at the LTA's Visually Impaired National Finals and won the B2 Mens Singles Event.

Visually Impaired Tennis (known as VI Tennis) is one of the leading sports for blind and partially sighted people in the UK.

This format of the game is different to traditional tennis – it's played on a smaller court with a lower net. Courts also have tactile lines (so players can touch them) and players also use an audible tennis ball that makes noise so they can hear it bounce and being hit.

Monday 13th September 2021 marked the opening of the first padel tennis courts in Wiltshire, courtesy of Padel4all who have built a three-court, canopy-covered centre at Bassett Down, near Swindon. The focus of the brand new centre will be to encourage the nearby and surrounding communities to participate in an active

lifestyle and to offer a positive playing experience for all ages and abilities on the highest quality courts.

The sport of padel is often referred to as a mix of tennis and squash because it is played on an enclosed court which combines the net element of tennis with the walls of squash. It is played in doubles, making it a highly sociable sport, with tactics and guile/finesse more important than strength and power.





In October the county held a Wiltshire Tennis Venue and Coach network event at the complex and attendees enjoyed trying Padel Tennis for the first time and hearing more about the venue.

WILTSHIRE TENNIS SAFEGUARDING 2021

Report from Liz Lewis – Wiltshire Tennis Safeguarding Officer Email: Safeguarding@wiltshiretennis.org.uk

General

We continue to work closely with the LTA to support high standards of safeguarding and event/activity management throughout the county. The county committees have participated in the LTA's mandatory safeguarding training for committees, and all LTA Registered venues should have scheduled the same training.

Documents on the Wiltshire Tennis website

Our policies and guidelines, including Safeguarding, Diversity and Inclusion. WhatsApp guidance for coaches, venues, volunteers and associates. Forms for players, coaches and county teams.

LTA Venue Safeguarding Support Visits (previously Safeguarding Audits)

Since their inauguration by the LTA, 226 LTA Registered Venues in the SW region have been audited/visited by Stuart Parsons, LTA Regional Safeguarding Manager – South West. For Wiltshire, 26 venues have been visited, four since April 2021. Thanks to all your sterling efforts, all of the Wiltshire venues referred to above have, at the time of writing (4 November), achieved or exceeded the minimum standards. A further four venues were due to be visited by 30 November.

Regional and National Context: Reported Concerns

From January 2020 to 4 November 2021 (a period which included lockdowns), a total of 60 concerns were reported from the SW region, 6 of which were from Wiltshire. Nine of the original sixty were categorised non-safeguarding; the remaining fifty-one concerns fall into one of nineteen other categories, all with a safeguarding element. During 2021, for the LTA as a whole, 233 concerns were raised to 4 November. None of the figures referenced above are related to any of the historical cases which are also being investigated by the LTA.

Management of Individual Venues

Congratulations to those venues which carry/publish up to date policies, especially their 'Safeguarding' and 'Diversity and Inclusion' policies signed and dated by the Chair and Welfare Officer. It is easy to let these slip, as time does indeed fly, but venues using the LTA's Venue Self-Assessment Form find this, and much more, easier to manage.

Safeguarding is everybody's responsibility. If you see something, say something.

SENIORS REPORTS - MEN 2021

WILTSHIRE SENIORS MENS TEAM CAPTAIN REPORT – MIKE POWELL E: angelaandmikepowell@talktalk.net

A year ago in November 2020, we were in the grip of the Coronavirus pandemic and had just gone into our second Lockdown, with Government restrictions forcing the LTA to review its plans for 2021. In view of all the uncertainties ahead, it was decided to run the 2021 Seniors County Cup on a more-localised regional basis to reduce travelling, overnight stays and hospitality. The regional Leagues would still be competitive but would be a one-off competition for 2021 without promotion & relegation rather than continue the previous sequential leagues run annually with promotion & relegation. In effect the 2021 matches would be friendly competition played on outdoor courts amongst neighbouring counties. As Coronavirus came under more control with vaccinations, Government restrictions were gradually eased, permitting easier travelling with overnight stays if necessary, hospitality and indoor play — almost back to normal!

Wiltshire Men chose to enter 4 teams only, as there were probably insufficient players available to field an M75 side. The 4 Team Captains: Hans Monahan (M55), Gavin Gibson (M60), James Sinclair (M65) and myself (M70) duly arranged fixture dates and venues, team selections and travelling for the scheduled matches, some home some away, from May onwards until end October.

The M55's first match at end May was rained off but rearranged for early June outdoors on a very hot Sunday at Marshfield TC against a strong Avon side, the team of Hans Monahan, Livio Pavone, Charles Faye & Nick Hewens losing 0-5, 0-10, 23-61. A stronger team of Gavin Gibson, Nick Breeds, Charles Faye & Nick Goddard was fielded in July away at West Hants against Dorset, winning one doubles rubber but losing the match 1-4, 2-8, 28-52. Devon was unfortunately unable to raise a team for the September match at Delta, so Wilts finished third of the 4 teams.

The M60's first outing in June had to be conceded at the last minute against Devon at Exeter Golf & Country Club owing to a late injury, but the team defeated Cornwall at Chippenham TC on another hot day in July, being restricted by agreement to doubles only, 3-1, 7-3, 43-27. There followed a narrow loss to Avon at Westbury-on-Trym by 2-3,

4-7, 37-51 in August and then a narrow win against Somerset at Riverside, Salisbury by 3-2, 7-4, 48-29 to finish 3rd out of 5 teams.

The M65 team of Paul Denyer, Andy Smith, James Sinclair, Glynn Stevens, Glen d'Mello & Colin Thomas, won all of their 5 matches with a great team effort. 4 of the 5 matches were won closely **by 3-2**: Somerset at Delta 7-4, 54-37; Devon at Delta 6-5, 44-38; Dorset at East Dorset TC 7-7, 44-52; Avon at Westbury-on-Trym 6-6, 45-46. The fifth match was won convincingly v South Wales 5-0, 10-0, 60-15, so Wiltshire finished top of the group undefeated!!

The M70 team of Paul Denyer, James Sinclair, Glen d'Mello, Peter Cooper, Colin Gratton, & Matt Holland also had a remarkable run, winning 4 out of 5 matches on games only: Somerset at Burnham-on-Sea 2-2, 4-4, 40-37; Avon at Westbury-on-Trym 2-2, 5-5, 37-35; Glos at Delta 2-2, 4-4, 37-32; Devon at Delta 2-2, 4-4, 34-31. Their only loss was to the strong South Wales side at Delta, whose captain was

David Stillman, younger brother of John, who was Wiltshire Mens Captain for many years. Wiltshire are likely to finish 2nd to South Wales.

In all the 4 Men's teams played 15 matches, winning 11 of them – certainly the best results achieved in many years. Decisions will now have to be made as to whether Wilts can enter an additional M75 side for 2022 without jeopardising the numbers available for the other teams, as the 2022 rules will revert to being more restrictive about playing down in a lower age group.

After 24 years of service as a committee member, the last 5 years which were as Chair, Neil Allen will be retiring from the committee in 2022. The league thanks Neil for all his years of dedicated service. The league is therefore seeking a replacement to take over the role from November 2022.
